ADHD / Behaviour Disorders affects many adults and vary in their presentation & severity. Diagnostic Assessment will allow a clinical diagnosis to better understand your needs.

Assessment Measures

• DSM – 5 Cross-Cutting Symptom Measure - Adult

Cross-cutting symptom measure aids in a comprehensive mental status assessment by drawing attention to symptoms that are important across diagnoses. It is intended to help identify areas of inquiry that may guide treatment and prognosis. Specifically, this measure is a brief survey of 13 domains for adults.

• Depression, Stress & Anxiety Scales (DASS 42)

Depression, Stress & Anxiety Scales (DASS 42) is a 42-item self-report instrument designed to evaluate three related negative emotional states of depression, anxiety and tension/stress.

• Conner's Adult ADHD Rating Scales (CAARS)

The Conner's Adult ADHD Rating Scales (CAARS) quantitatively measures ADHD symptoms across clinically significant domains while examining the manifestations of ADHD in adults. The long self-report (CAARS-S:L) and observer (CAARS-O:L) forms include 66 items and contain nine empirically derived scales that assess a broad range of problem behaviours. They include three DSM-IV Symptom measures (Inattentive, Hyperactive-Impulsive and Total ADHD Symptoms), a 12-item ADHD Index, and an Inconsistency Index.

• Comprehensive Executive Function Inventory (CEFI)

The Comprehensive Executive Function Inventory Adult (CEFI Adult™) Self-Report Form is used to quantify an individual's level of executive function. In combination with other information, results from the CEFI Adult help calibrate an individual's level of executive function in the following areas: Attention, Emotion Regulation, Flexibility, Inhibitory Control, Initiation, Organization, Planning, SelfMonitoring, and Working Memory.

• MOXO™

The MOXO™ is performance based computer program test that provides accurate measurements of all four core symptoms of ADHD: Hyper-Reactivity, Inattention, Timing and Impulsivity.

• Adaptive Behaviour Assessment System – 3rd Edition (ABAS III)

The ABAS-III is a multidimensional and standardised assessment tool used to assess the functional skills necessary for daily living of individuals between 0 to 89 years of age. This measure assesses 11 essential skill areas within 3 major adaptive domains: Conceptual, Social, and Practical, facilitating the identification of strengths and weaknesses.
