

Autism Spectrum Disorder Child



Autism Spectrum Disorder affects many children and varies in its presentation and severity. Diagnostic Assessment will allow a clinical ciagnosis to better understand the needs of your child.

Assessment Measures

- The Conner's Comprehensive Behaviour Rating Scale (CBRS)

 The Conner's CBRS is designed to give a complete overview of child and adolescent disorders and concerns. This age range for this electronically delivered assessment tool is 6-18 or parent and teacher forms and 8-18 for self-report forms
- Autism Spectrum Rating Scale (ASRS)
 The Autism Spectrum Rating Scale (ASRS) is a multidimensional and standardised assessment tool used to quantify observations of children and youth (aged 2 to 18 years old) that are associated with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). When used in combination with other information, results from the ASRS Parent Form or ASRS Teacher Form can help determine the likelihood that a youth has symptoms associated with Autism Spectrum Disorder; this information can then be used to determine treatment targets. The ASRS Parent Form and ASRS Teacher Form are electronically administered.
- Autism Diagnostic Observations Schedule (ADOS)
 The Autism Diagnostic Observation Schedule accurately assesses autism spectrum disorders across ALL ages, developmental levels, and language skills. The ADOS-2 is a semi-structured, standardised assessment that includes a number of play-based activities designed to obtain information in the areas of communication, reciprocal social interactions, and restricted and repetitive behaviours associated with a diagnosis of ASD
 - Autism Diagnostic Interview-Revised (ADI-R)

 The Autism Diagnostic Interview-Revised (ADI-R) is designed for diagnosing autism,
 planning treatment, and distinguishing autism from other developmental disorders. It is a
 standardised, semi-structured parent or observer clinical interview that is administered faceto-face by a trained clinician.
 - Adaptive Behaviour Assessment System 3rd Edition (ABAS III)

 The ABAS-III is a multidimensional and standardised assessment tool used to assess the functional skills necessary for daily living of individuals between 0 to 89 years of age. This measure assesses 11 essential skill areas within 3 major adaptive domains: Conceptual, Social, and Practical, facilitating the identification of strengths and weaknesses.
