Learning /Cognitive & Academic Child



Learning Disabilities effect many children and varies in its presentation and severity. Diagnostic Assessment will allow a clinical diagnosis to better understand the needs of your child.

Assessment Measures

The Conner's Comprehensive Behaviour Rating Scale (CBRS)

The Conner's CBRS is designed to give a complete overview of child and adolescent disorders and concerns. This age range for this electronically delivered assessment tool is 6-18 or parent and teacher forms and 8-18 for self-report forms

The Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children – 5th Edition (WISC V)

The WISC-V is used to measure the general thinking and reasoning skills of children aged 6 to 16 years. This assessment provides a composite score that represents a childs overall intellectual ability (FSIQ), as well as primary index scores that measure the following areas of cognitive functioning: verbal comprehension, visual spatial processing, fluid reasoning, working memory, and processing speed.

The Wechsler Individual Achievement Test -3rd Edition (WIAT III)

The WIAT-III requires individuals aged 4 years to 59 years, to complete several academically based tasks that draw on specific skills acquired through formal education. Results are interpreted in relation to a large, random sample of the student's age-matched peers. The WIAT-III provides an indication of the student's oral language, reading, written language and mathematical abilities.

Adaptive Behaviour Assessment System – 3rd Edition (ABAS III)

The ABAS-III is a multidimensional and standardised assessment tool used to assess the functional skills necessary for daily living of individuals between 0 to 89 years of age. This measure assesses 11 essential skill areas within 3 major adaptive domains: Conceptual, Social, and Practical, facilitating the identification of strengths and weaknesses.
